Dear Sylvia:

Your revised index to vol. II and vol. I of the legislative hearings arrived today. I've xeroxed them, kept copies for myself, passed the rest on to Paul and am returning the originals. I'll wait for your notations on the subjects from the legislative indexes. A wise choice on omitting that ACLU material, by the way.

I was sorry to hear we couldn't get a list of witnesses from Blakey. Paul's send out of 8/25 contained no such list, only the suggestion that someone should put one together. I pass along a copy in case you don't have it. Lacking cooperation from Blakey, about the only way we can get names of witnesses in executive sessions and private interviews is through the footnotes in the Report and appendixes. This, of course, will be only a partial list (presumably) of those interviewed outside the public hearings, but it's better than nothing. What do you think? If we're pressed for time, it's something I think I could put a couple of students onto. Let me know.

From the looks of your index to the legislative stuff, I get some idea of how the subject matter could drive you bonkers. My sympathies! I thought doing Gerry Ford et. al. in vol. III was mind-numbing, but that legislative material appears to be a miracle cure for insomniacs! You did a first-rate job nonetheless.

That's it for now. I'm trying to plow through student papers so I can get the material on names ready for my volunteers.
