Dear Mrs. Meagher:

I have read with interest your recent book "Accessories after the Fact". Both Mr. Lane and yourself in your book (pages 254-255) speak of a one Mr. T.F. Bowley who allegedly looked at his watch after the Tippit killing and saw that his watch registered 1:10 P.M. Mr. Bowley was never interviewed by the Commission. It has occurred to me that if Mr. Bowley recognized at the time that the exact time of the shooting was so important, as he obviously did because he immediately consulted his watch, he must also have ascertained whether in fact his watch was keeping correct time that day. Perhaps it is not too late even now to get in touch with Mr. Bowley and ask him about his watch. I understand that you have numerous contacts around the country who are interested in the assassination. Have you ever thought of either getting in contact with Mr. Bowley or asking one of your friends in Dallas to do it.

If we can ascertain whether or not Mr. Bowley's watch was keeping correct time that day, we can come one step closer to an unraveling of the mystery.
