Dear Senator Holland,

A story in a recent issue of the Los Angeles Free Press quotes you as saying in a letter dated March 20, 1967 that you doubt if the truth about the Kennedy assassination will become known in our time, partly because of obstruction of further investigation and impounding of vital evidence by the Kennedy family.

I share your view that the Kennedy family has taken a most unfortunate and incomprehensible position in the matter. And, if the people and their elected representatives submit to such arbitrary and wholly improper interference with the course of justice, it is quite likely that the truth will not be discovered and that the Warren Report will remain a permanent stain on the national honor.

May I say, most respectfully, that we need not submit passively to the dicta of the Kennedy family or the Administration but, on the contrary, must exert every possible effort to reverse this terrible miscarriage of justice by pressing for a new investigation of the events in Dallas 1963. I should like to express the hope that you will initiate or support such an effort.
