Dear Mr. Bogart,

Thank you for your letter of the 21st and the enclosed reprints and other materials, which I shall read with interest.

You are to be congratulated for your energetic efforts to combat environmental pollution and radioactivity, surely one of the major and most ominous problems which the human race faces. It is difficult to judge which of the many dangers produced by an increasingly mechanized and technological system is the greatest danger in ultimate terms, and there are just not enough hours in the day for one to learn about or to act upon all the urgent questions which confront the individual and the community.

I will certainly keep in mind the points you make about the Kennedys and atomic energy as I pursue my work on the Warren Report and the dreadful recent assassinations, although I should like to be quite frank in saying that I do not see any basis at this time for linking the two phenomena in terms of cause and effect. Unless specific evidence becomes available to pinpoint one of the many vested interests or extremist groups to which the Kennedys may have been inimical, I would regard them all as equally "suspect."

I am trying to clear my desk for a badly-needed leave from the office and perhaps some vacation, having worked without a break since the Warren Report was published late in 1964. Perhaps we can have a talk later on. Meanwhile, all good wishes for a pleasant summer,
