Since there was no conspiracy in Dallas per the WR, why should <u>anything</u> pertaining to it be classified for 75 years? Why should we or anyone else have to accept the word of National Archivist Marion Johnson, or anyone else, for what is or is not in the record.

To me, the unanswered questions about the JFK matter form the festering core upon which our deteriorating society feeds. Only when that sore has been purged and clean tissue begins to grow again will we begin to heal our social wounds. Whatever the truth is, it could not be nearly so damaging as the untruth and half-truth which is sapping our strength in the world now.

Sooner or later, the prints are going to be made available. The Austin source has decided not to fill its orders for the present, however, and this closes the only open door I know about right now.

I am re-reading your book with the goal of picking out enough items to challenge Bishop to write a book on "The Day Oswald was Framed". In one exchange of letters, we discussed the rumor that Fred Korth had obtained a divorce for Oswalds mother. I cannot find your reply on this and wonder if you would give me the dope on it again, when and if you have time.

In regard to filing suit to get the records open, I know such things cost a great deal. I would be willing to contribute to this action and undoubtedly there are many other, who would also.
