I have prepared the enclosed excerpts of a COMPLAINT, about which you may already have learned from your Los Angeles contacts, since the full text is rather lengthy. I think that the salient points are all set forth, even if sketchily, in the excerpts. I should be interested in your reaction to this brief, especially to the account of the autopsy findings. Should you wish to see the full text of the brief, just let me know.

The news of your election as President of the Academy of Forensic Sciences reached me via Denmark, courtesy of Tink Thompson, and I have been intending for some time to write and express my congratulations and my admiration. It is a special pleasure and a real satisfaction to know that your remarkable achievements and your leadership qualities have been recognized by election to an honored office, by your confreres as earlier by the electorate.

The demands on your time must be enormous, so do not take the trouble to reply unless you do want to pursue the questions raised in the enclosed excerpts.

One other thing--If you should be asked by John Nebel to take part in a discussion of a recent book on the JFK assassination, written by Al Newman, please let me know in advance. I have been told that there is a good probability that such a discussion will be scheduled. As it happens, I had been reading Newman's book with some care and I offered to brief Paris Flammonde and/or any other panelist on the vulnerable aspects of this latest attempt to legitimize the single bullet--lone assassin findings in the WR.
