Warren Report Still Questioned

QUESTION: After five years, what do you think about the Warren report?

AL SZMURLO, New York City: "I don't agree completely with the Commission, because I feel that they were hiding a lot of facts. Right now I would say there had to be someone else involved, and I don't want to wait 40 years to find out who it was."

LARRY PARDUBSKY, Cedar Rapids, Iowa: "I think the report deliberately covered up evidence or the possibility of a conspiracy between Oswald and others. I personally feel that there is a group, perhaps the one that was responsible for the assassination of Kennedy, in this country whose function is to kill high persons in the government."

MRS. RICHARD LAWLEY, Birmingham, Ala.: "I think the report is too little, too late. I'm sure the government is covering up facts, but what good is finding out the truth at this late date?"

MRS. H. B. LOLLARD, Birmingham, Ala.: "I disagree with the report, and I feel that Washington is covering up a lot of the facts. I do have a feeling that Oswald and Ruby had a connection with each other but I don't think the truth will ever be known."

MRS. RITA HEFFERNAN, Ogden, Utah: "Basically, I agree with the report although I think it left a lot of questions unanswered in my mind. There were too many things hidden from the people that should have been made public."

LEE GROSKOPF, Colorado Springs, Colo.: "I don't see how the report could say that only one man plotted and carried out the assassination. I'm convinced more people were involved."

MURRAY BROSIUS, Nashville, Tenn.: "I agree with the Warren Commission because I think Oswald was psychotic and was willing to sacrifice his life to make a name for himself. It seems to me that he had a John Wilkes Booth complex."

MRS. GEORGE ZABACK, San Francisco: "The Commission has proved only the possibility that one man committed the assassination, just as others have proved the same for a conspiracy. It's still a big question in my mind, and I tend to think there was a conspiracy."

KATHARINA JUECKENMOELLER, Steinhagen, Germany: "I have heard much about the Warren Report, but I definitely think it was a conspiracy. We have a very good news system in Germany, and what I saw was too well organized for just one man."
