I have read your recent undated letter several times, without becoming entirely sure that I understand your request correctly.

Your comments about my book <u>Accessories</u> are, of course, gratifying. You say that you are familiar with the literature on the assassination but need to evaluate what is fact and what is fiction. I would have thought that such an evaluation was the core of your research project. No one's judgment—and least of all the judgment of an interested party—can really substitute for your own judgment.

In any case, I have not been working actively on the case for some time, partly because of ill health. I can recommend to you an annotated bibliography on the assassination of President Kennedy, by David R. Wrone, published in the Wisconsin Magazine of History for Autumn 1972. Wrone describes and evaluates much of the massive literature on the assassination and you might find his commentaries useful.

Should you have any specific question that I may be able to answer without undertaking a search among my files and records, I would be glad to help. Best of good luck on your project, which I should like very much to read when it is near final form and, if you wish, give you my comments.
