Dear Mr. Wentworth,

I did appreciate your kind note of the 24th of April in which you called attention to the article by Kirkpatrick Sale in the New York Review of Books, which I have now read with great interest. Surely it does appear that there are links—however tenuous, implicit or analagous—between the several crises which have occurred since the fateful date 11/22/63 in Dallas, crises which repeatedly have placed the legitimacy of the Government in grave doubt.

The dizzying pace of sordid revelations in the last few days and the lopping off of White House heads yesterday and the mortifying rhetoric of last night ("I love this country...God Bless America!") reaffirm the truth of the axiom that patriotism is the last refuge of a scoundrel. I think and I hope that this vast and ugly scandal will lead the public and the press to reexamine the credence too lightly given to the Warren Report, and perhaps lead also to the first impeachment of a President.
