PRESS RELEASE

The Assassination Information Bureau will sponsor a national conference, "The Politics of Conspiracy", to discuss political assassinations of the past decade and their relationship to the American political structure. The conference will be held Friday January 31st thru February 2nd at Boston University.

Topics to be covered will include the murders of John and Robert Kennedy and Martin Luther King, the shooting of George Wallace and the Chappaquidick incident. The conference will also examine clandestine activities of the CIA,FBI, and other intelligence agencies. Workshops will be held on possible courses of action to resolve major American political crimes.

Among the participants will be researchers and investigators such as Mark Lane, Penn Jones, Mae Brussel, Donald Freed, Wayne Chastain, Peter Dale Scott, Robert Cutler, Sherman Skolnick, Theorer Charach, and representatives of the Fifth Estate.

Conference events will begin at 8PM Friday night, and will run all day Saturday beginning at 10AM and Sunday beginning at noon. All events are open to the public, with registration fees of \$7.00 for the entire conference or \$3.00 for each individual day. The AIB for the past two years has distributed the known facts on political assassinations to the widest possible audience. Our major activity has been an audio-visual examination of the murder of John Kennedy, which has been presented at over two hundred colleges and universities in forty states. The enormous public response to these lectures and the number of persons who have expressed the desire to consider and act upon the implications of the available evidence is what has led the AIB to call for this conference.
