beings.

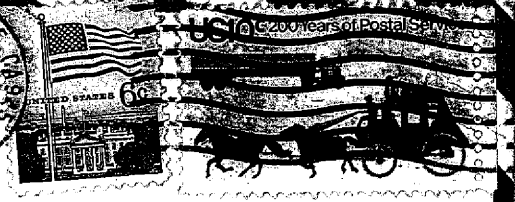
I do hope we meet - I have
