Congratulations on the republication of your book! I am so happy that your excellent work will once again be available, and on a larger scale than before.

A.S. Barnes will reissue my book at the end of the month, and will try to make a go of it (unlike Fairleigh Dickinson, which is not equipped to promote its books). The price will be reduced to \$8.95, and it will feature a new, more attractive cover, a photo section and a somewhat revised introduction. I have taken off a quarter from law school in the hope that the publisher will be able to arrange some sort of promotion tour. I needed the rest from school, anyway, and have had time in the past few weeks to go back over assassination material to refresh my memory and dealve into areas I'd avoided before.

I've enclosed a couple memos ^(X) which I prepared recently after having had my interest in several areas sparked by my review of materials. I thought the lengthier memo, dealing with the 605 Elsbeth address, would be of interest to you since you included an excellent treatment of it in your book. I hope this is not an imposition on you (I take it you are busy with your book). Please don't feel obliged to comment, unless you want to.

I've also enclosed a letter to Paul Hoch which I thought would be of interest to you. I was glad to see that the anthology included so much of your work, but I have serious questions about some of the other selections. I thought Paul's contributions were, on the whole, excellent.

I hope you are well, and I wish you the very best of luck with your book.
