an important find. The 10 vs 10:30 timing casts still further doubt on the possibility of premeditation. Also interesting, to me, is Truly's suggestion that the motorcade could have proceeded right down Main St. sans detour. That is what one of the traffic policemen said also. I have argued this with Leo Sauvage repeatedly. Finally, I am impressed by the whole pro-Oswald tenor of Truly in the Hosty interview. It disappeared later but Truly's first response was to reject the whole idea of Oswald's guilt... or at least of his premeditation. (On re-reading what I have just written, I think it overstates the case. Yet if I read correctly between the lines there is a certain pro-Oswald quality in Truly's statements.)
