It would be wonderful to get together with you and have a long talk. Any chance of your visiting New York soon? Or maybe I could even come to Pittsburgh, now that I am retired from the United Nations and am no longer pinned to a desk.

I do hope that you and the family are well and thriving. Please let me hear from you when you have a chance.
