Dear Roger,

I have read and re-read both your letters about the receipt for the bullet. I had not seen the National Examiner and am very sorry to learn that they printed the story and reproduced the receipt. Very mischievous, to have such an important piece of evidence surface that way, and in that kind of rag.

However, for me to contact Lane and take him to task is really out of the question. He is incorrigibly amoral and unashamedly brazen. He and Harold are long at war with each other, in the MLK case as well as on Dallas evidence, and I am not surprised that Lane has again claimed credit for the results of Harold's long efforts.

At the risk of seeming to lack perspicacity, I have to admit that I do not entirely understand your reasoning about the receipt for the bullet. All I can promise is that if I hear from Tannenbaum, and if he does come to see me, as he suggested, I will try to arrange for you yourself to discuss the receipt with him, so that you will have every opportunity to place your concern before the House Select Committee via Tannenbaum.

Let me know how things are going in your suit against CBS, etc. Incidentally, I finally had my visit with Mark Mousky at WNEW-TV. He merely wanted to air his various theories on Dallas and Watergate, which were highly speculative and unsupported by real evidence. He apparently never heard of Occam's Razor. His theories of Dallas include a Castro and/or Soviet hypothesis, which I was unable to disabuse him of.
