I should like to acknowledge receipt of your letter of 16 May 1977, and thank you, in your capacity as Staff Counsel for the House Select Committee on Assassinations, for inviting me to contribute materials and suggestions that might be of assistance in your investigative activities. Actually, I have previously sent various items to this Committee, at their request. Perhaps they will assist you in locating the various published articles that I submitted some months ago, and also give you a more complete perspective of some of the items that I have in my personal files dealing with the JFK assassination.

At the risk of appearing to be immodest and presumptuous, I nevertheless shall take this occasion to state that I would welcome the opportunity to assist the Committee as a medical expert in the field of forensic pathology, and would also be willing to testify before the Committee.
