I have had an original harback edition of your ACCESSORIES AFTER THE FACT for many years and it is THE definitive work in my opinion. I never did manage to obtain a copy of your HEARINGS AND EXHIBITS SUBJECT INDEX but I'm lucky enough to have a local reference library which has it along with the 26 Volumes.

I'm enclosing a copy of our meager effort in the bibliography line along with some backnumbers of the newsletter. I have the update prepared for the years 1975/76 but lack of current funds has held back a printed supplement and addendum. I hope you enjoy JFK.AF - you will notice that you are mentioned a few times in its columns!

I'll appreciate your reactions - and criticisms!

(2) Are you aware of the existence of a mimeographed pamphlet - MAN IN THE MIDDLE. THE INSIDE STORY by Richard Case Nagell, and, if so, could you help out with a xerox copy?

(3) Does your archive contain any material in reference to the FILM version of FAREWELL AMERICA (based on the book by "James Hepburn")? I think(?) there was, for instance, an article in a past issue of RAMPARTS.
