Dear Mr. Candler,

I have just today returned from travel abroad to find your most interesting letter of the 16th of August. Thank you for writing to me and for your generous remarks about my work on the JFK assassination. I have not worked actively on the case for a number of years but am frequently drawn into discussions or other activities, sometimes against my preferences. However, I have never lost interest in this great historical tragedy and massive injustice to the accused, Lee Harvey Oswald, whom I believe to be wholly innocent. I will never be indifferent to the results of any serious, responsible research, or any prospect of a break-through in uncovering the truth.

For that reason, I am naturally somewhat excited about your discovery in the Warren Report itself of evidence that several individuals had prior knowledge that shots were to be fired in Dealey Plaza. I would be most interested in hearing your evidence and your argument and, if it appeared to me to hold the significance which you claim for it, I might even be in a position to see that the information is given serious official attention, with the understanding of course that you would receive full credit for your discovery.

Indeed, if you remain willing to share your findings with me, I would hope that you would do so by very early return mail--it would be helpful for the information to arrive before the 15th of September, if that is not inconvenient for you.

I will look forward to your reply. Again, my thanks for your letter.
