Dear Sylvia:

Yes, Earl Golz is working on the two documents. We are fairly certain that #963 is referring to film footage taken by Channel 4 in Dallas. The document mentions Eddie Barker. He was program director, as I remember it, for the station during those days. He now has a public relations firm here in Dallas, and will probably remember the "closed circuit film" when Earl manages to interview him.

We are having a little more trouble with Charles Bronson. The document gives his employment, but the spelling is inaccurate. Bronson completely did a disappearing act following the assassination. Earl has made a number of calls trying to locate him. I had already tried a "Charles Bronson Studio" in the current Dallas telephone directory. Turned out to be a woman named Bronson Charles who is an artist.

Earl has been concentrating more on the Charles Bronson rolls of film since we feel almost certain that the closed circuit film will be less interesting. I have confidence that Earl will chase both of the items to conclusion...

I really appreciated your lists of documents. They are very helpful. I seem to be constantly reading documents of one kind or another, and I get so groggy sometimes that I can't remember whether I saw a name in the document I just put down or in one I read last week... I like lists, indices, etc., anything that will assist in finding what I want - when I want it. I try to index and cross-index them so many ways that, one of these days, I'm going to have more index cards than I have documents!

Did you hear Preyer and Stokes on Good Morning, America? I taped it. Was glad to hear that they have solved all the major problems of the Kennedy assassination! Of course, they are being more cautious about the King assassination until after the election. They wouldn't want to alienate any constituents of Ford, Stokes, Burke, etc., by saying there was no conspiracy before November 7th. They'll end up by saying Ray read some pamphlet put out by the White Citizens Council and it provoked him to assassination — alone!

Over all, I think we learned much more from the Hearings than they intended for us to learn. (I'd like to suggest a remedial reading course for Blakey.)
