Dear Michael,

After our telephone conversation yesterday, I made a number of phonecalls without, I am sorry to say, any success. No one is willing or able to travel to Charlotte to interview you unless they know in advance exactly what information or evidence you have. The AIB (Jeff Goldberg and Carl Oglesby) would be happy to see you if you came to Washington and to hear your information, and if the information warrants it, would take you to the House Committee and try to ensure that you get a hearing from its staff. That is, obviously, very "iffy" and does not seem to meet your conditions. Incidentally, I am told that the House Committee will come to an end on the last day of this year and that there is no real likelihood of any extension of its term for a few more months.

In the very short time that remains, I doubt that it will be possible to bring you together with the House Committee. I imagine that if Blakey replies to your letter of December 6th, he will maintain his position that you should write or phone him and transmit your evidence.

If the situation changes, I will of course write or phone you at once. Meanwhile, I was glad to talk with you yesterday and I do appreciate the generous remarks you made about my book. With every good wish,
