Dear Sylvia,

You may care to see the letter, which I have just written to the Australian edition of TIME. Whether you agree or not, you will I hope recognize that at long last I am getting a grip of the 26 volumes.

I have my 12 chapters in draft, and now occupied in checking every single statement against the Warren Report, and verifying that every reference is correct. --- Naturally one often finds there is more in the reference than one had supposed!! --- I was indeed fortunate that the U.S. Government presented the 26 volumes to the Adelaide University Library. --- But from the appearance of the volumes, NEOSUSPECT that I am the first to read them in all of 15 years!!!!

"A Fourth Shot" (Time 79ja1) shows that after 15 years few have read the evidence placed before the Warren Commission with understanding.

Kellerman (2H92) reported that when he held an X-ray of the President's head in front of a point source of light, he saw 50 bright stars. These stars can only have been lead particles, so this the sixth bullet fired was soft-nosed, or if one prefers an older term, a "dum-dum".





