Dear Linda:

Recently, my children have expressed a strong desire to live with their father. He is planning on moving to the E. Brunswick area around the first of the year (of course I realize that this might never come to pass). In the event this does occur, (hopefully on a temporary basis), what would the legal implications be? Specifically, I would be concerned with:


1. Custody. I want to retain my custodial rights over the children.
2. Support. It would really be ironic at this point if he could get child support from me. I would want to be insured against me having to contribute to their support while they were under his roof. What is my legal position on this?
3. If the children would return to my home - could I arrange to do this only subject to his provision for child support at that time?
4. Debts. Would the divorce decree position on debts be jeopardized?

Linda, in other words, where do I stand? I am in a situation now where if I prevent the children from doing this I feel that I am inhibiting their rights as well as breeding extreme resentment and hostility. I have expressed my feelings to them that if this is what they want I will not prohibit them. I think they are feeling a bit curious as to 'Life with Father', and quite candidly, I feel that they should have the day in day out experience of this. It might work, then again it might turn out to be a temporary situation.

I would only consent to such an arrangement with a legal agreement signed by myself and M. Nasper. Please advise me as soon as possible. Not only do I need to be psychologically prepared, but legally protected.

I'm anxious to hear from you as soon as possible. Please contact me so we can arrange to discuss this.
