I should like to congratulate you and Ms. Sherry Shapiro on the bibliography on the assassination of President John F. Kennedy which you prepared for the House Select Committee on Assassinations and which appears in the Committee's Appendix to Hearings, Volume XII. Your bibliography will certainly be a useful resource to researchers, now and in the future.

That being said, I hope that you will not consider it carping if I call attention to several regrettable features. My book, Accessories After the Fact, was first published in 1967 by Bobbs Merrill, Inc. Your bibliography lists only the second edition, published by Random House in 1976, and the chronological version of the bibliography therefore does not reflect the fact that my book was a 1967 work but places it nine years later. Perhaps a small point, but one that causes me some distress.

While your bibliography does list a number of my magazine articles, the list is not exhaustive. For your information, I enclose herewith a complete list of my published articles.

Finally, a number of major works—some early and some quite recent—do not appear in your bibliography. I have taken the liberty of preparing a list of the omitted works, which I enclose herewith.
