PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY ASSASSINATION FILM CHRONOLOGY:

Specially prepared compilation of the various amateur and professional films of the President Kennedy motorcade on November 22, 1963. The comprehensive chronology of film footage documents the Presidential motorcade from Love Field, through the downtown Dallas area, to the Dealey Plaza assassination.

Included in the film chronology are blow-up sequences (rotoscope process) of key segments of the assassination related footage, as well as slow-motion sequences, freeze-frames, and other specially prepared graphic effects.

The chronology utilizes amateur film footage as well as professional newsreel and television film recorded along the parade route, from motorcade vehicles, and in the Plaza at the time of the shooting. <u>Including</u> the following footage:
