the family.

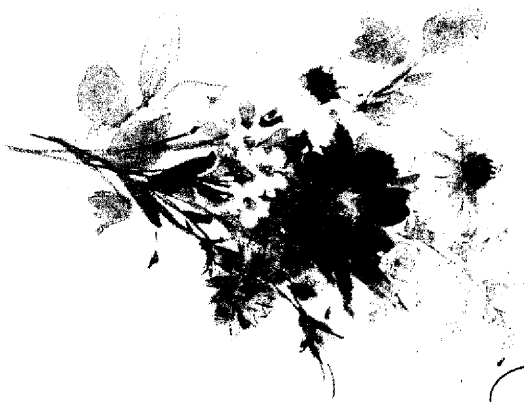
Thumpkin is a sweet &
