is a most significant question, given the emotional atmosphere rampant in Texas at the time of Lee Harvey Oswald's burial: Someone, whether under true name or not, had the fortitude, and faith in Lee Harvey Oswald, and stamina in shocked circumstances, to make a "gesture" by ordering this funeral spray. It would seem to me that the sender of the "gesture" possessed, or believed he or she possessed, current reliable information which would have exonerated Lee Harvey Oswald had he lived.
