Nothing else new that I know of. Everybody seems to be going for the copout, where were you when you first heard that JFK was assassinated? Judy Tague told me that GMA had sent an entire (and to her large) TV crew to Dallas to tape this for later airing. (She was in 10th-grade algebra class.)

While I'm not sorry that I did not try to identify my 1966 source on LHO's clearances because it is essential to preserve confidentiality when requested, I am sorry he wanted anonymity. There were six in the shipment but one was reassigned to the east coast, according to the testimony.
