

In 1961 Richard Nixon bought 2 pieces of land (at a discount from the existing mortgage) in the Trousdale Estates development in Beverly Hills. The Trousdale Estates were financed by the Central States Pension Fund. Eugene Brading's office for his oil business was located in Beverly Hills.

During World War II, Jack Ruby's brother (Samuel Rubenstein) was in Army Air Force Intelligence. (Warren Commission, p. 69E)

Here is the picture the Warren Commission and LIFE magazine did not want to show the public. The Warren Commission and LIFE magazine intentionally printed only the left half of the picture. (Warren Commission Exhibit 900 and LIFE magazine October 2, 1964, page 50A) The right half of the picture shows the Dal-Tex Building. LBJ's Secret Service car door was open by Zapruder Frame 166.

The assassin and his rifle (with silencer) can be seen in the second-floor window of the Dal-Tex Building (hiding behind the fire-escape). The rifle looks "fat" because of the 2"-3" diameter silencer on the barrel. The assassin's face has shadows on left ear, below nose, and on top of head. The eyes, nose, forehead, and cheek bone can be seen. The assassin appears to be left-handed. Note the pillow on fire-escape. This hides the rifle from oncoming motorcade.

The elevator operator in the Dal-Tex Building saw a Mr. Eugene Hale Brading in the Dal-Tex Building. Mr. Eugene Brading (also known as Jim Braden or James Bradley Lee) was later arrested by police outside the building (later to be released). Now, in November 1963, Brading was out of prison and had received permission from his parole officer for travel to Texas on oil business. He arrived in Dallas on November 21 and checked into Suite 301 of the Cabana Motel along with one Morgen Brown. In the afternoon he was seen at the offices of H.L. Hunt, the oil tycoon, an address Ruby visited at about the same time. On the night before the President's murder, Jean West was staying at the Cabana Motel as the companion of Lawrence Meyers, the friend Jack Ruby visited that midnight. (A check of David Ferrie's telephone records reveals that eight weeks earlier he made a call to Chicago number WH 4-4970. This, it turns out, was the number of an apartment building which in 1963 housed one Jean West.) The Meyers brothers (Lawrence and Ed) had dinner with Ruby at the Bon Vivant Room of the Cabana Motel the night before the assassination. (Ed Meyers was one of the owners of a Pepsico bottling company in Queens, New York controlled by Arundel, the same man who worked closely with Joseph McCarthy. Ed Meyers visited Mexico during November 1963 and was also in Dallas attending the bottlers' convention when Nixon was there.) Jim Garrison reports that a check of the records of the Cabana Motel for November 1963 revealed that Meyers' son, Ralph, was also there. Ralph Meyers was an Army Intelligence agent with a crypto-clearance, who had been stationed at a top-secret base in Turkey. Meyers spoke with Ruby for thirty minutes on the night before Ruby shot Oswald; he has also been linked to David Ferrie through the long distance telephone records of the automotive supply house he worked for. Just before shooting Oswald, Ruby called Barney Baker. Baker, who had just gotten out of prison, was in touch with Earl Scheib (according to Baker's telephone records), whose son, Philip, was friendly with Eugene Hale Brading. Ruby also called the head of the Teamsters Southern Conference and a Teamster bondsman before he killed Oswald.

Eugene Hale Brading had a long arrest record, a long history of association with organized crime, and was a charter member of the La Costa Club, located twenty miles south of San Clemente. Financed by the Teamsters and owned by Meyer Lansky's "front man" Moe Dalitz, La Costa was frequented by many organized crime figures as well as Nixon's close friend Murray Chotiner. La Costa Club was also where Nixon's aides John Dean, John Ehrlichman and H.R. Haldeman met to get their stories about the Watergate cover-up synchronized. Peter Noyes (CBS-TV news reporter in Los Angeles) reports that Brading had an office next door to Ferrie's in New Orleans and that he was in Los Angeles the night Robert Kennedy was shot. (David Ferrie worked out of Room 1707, Pèrè Marquette Building, New Orleans. Eugene Brading was connected with Rooms 1706 and 1701.)

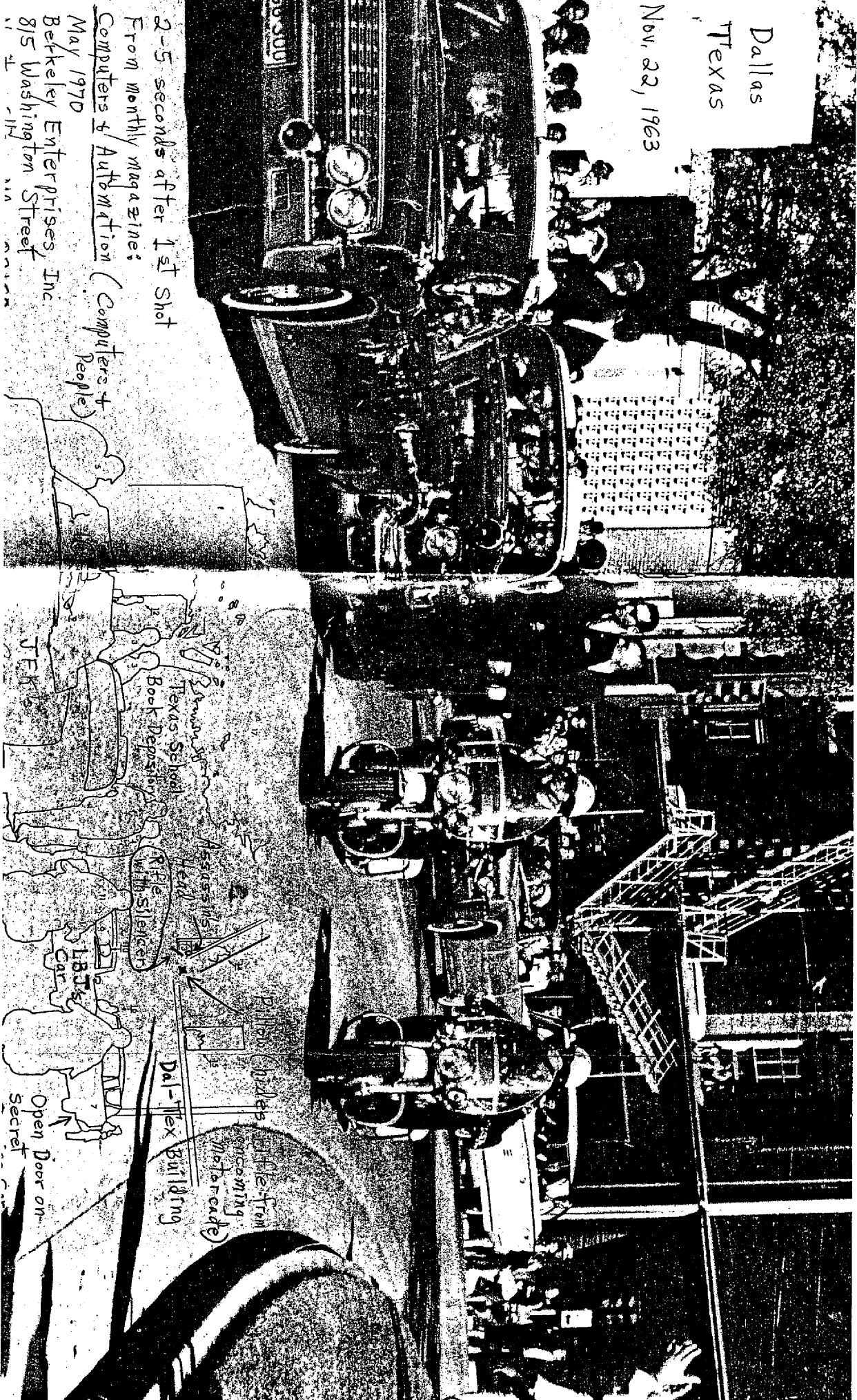
The Capistrano Beach Club (San Clemente, Calif.) can be found on a 1966 Rand McNally Road Atlas (but not on recent editions). The Capistrano Beach Club was used as an OSS (CIA) training school. Is there any relationship between the Capistrano Beach Club and the La Costa Club? The recent Teamster President (Jackie Presser) was discovered to be an undercover government agent. (Watergate burglar E. Howard Hunt was one of the founders of the Cuban Revolutionary Council. This was located at 544 Camp Street in New Orleans. Lee Harvey Oswald, David Ferrie, and Guy Banister were seen in this building.) George de Mohrenschildt (before his 1977 suicide, see Newsweek and TIME magazines) claimed he had been the middleman in a conspiracy of rich Texas oilmen (headed by H.L. Hunt), Jack Ruby, various CIA and FBI officials, a trucking company executive (Teamsters?), and anti-Castro Cubans. De Mohrenschildt (via Oltmans) provided House Committee with a picture of a claimed Cuban assassin.

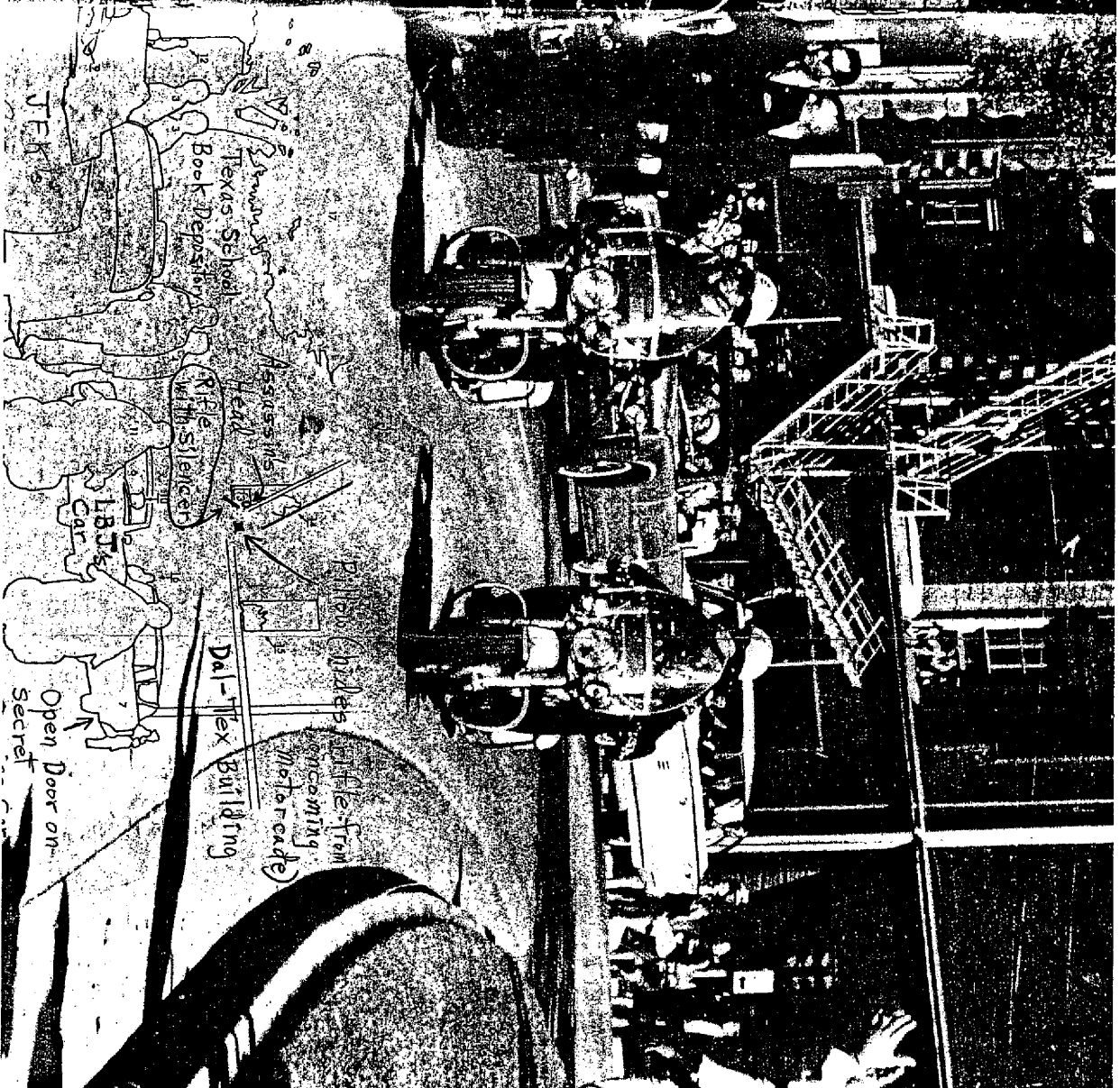

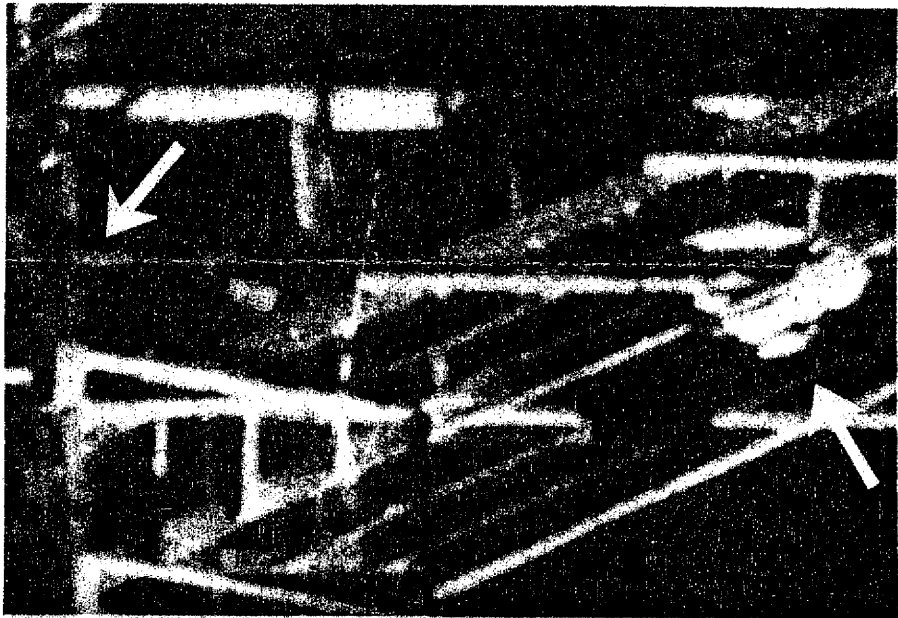

This is greedily enlarged from pinhead size on a 35mm negative. Professional Photographer Allgens belatedly was heard for but 15 minutes, although his is the most important single picture. A man was arrested in this building. The Report ignored that also.

ally told the Commission that even one call was "redundant". Of course, Dr. Humes said, he had not told Dr. Perry what his findings would report. Asked the specific question, Dr. Humes replied, without hesitation or equivocation, "No, sir; I did not." Immediately the transcript reads, "(a short recess was taken.)".

This account is directly contradicted by Dr. Kemp Clark, Director of Neurological Surgery at Parkland Hospital, Dallas, where the President was taken. He testified that, after hearing from Dr. Humes, "Dr. Perry stated that he had talked to the Bethesda Naval Hospital on two occasions that morning and that he knew what the autopsy findings had shown and that he did not wish to be questioned by the press, as he had been asked by Bethesda to combine his remarks . . .". There were, according to Dr. Clark, two other doctors present during this conversation with Dr. Perry, The Commission was undisturbed by this revelation of what a layman might consider somebody's false swearing about a material point.

With this background, some of Dr. Humes's more important changes have added significance. They dealt with whether or not the President was shot from the front. If he had been, no one man, Oswald or any other, could have simultaneously fired upon him from both front and back, and the entire Report is nullified.

The word "puncture" gave him most trouble, for applied to a bullet wound, it means the point of entrance. The first time he used it was in the fourth paragraph of his "Clinical Summary". This is also the time he forgot to strike it out in the handwritten draft, this paragraph begins, "Dr. Perry noted, the massive wound of the head and a second, puncture wound, of the low anterior neck in approximately the midline." Either there was another, undisclosed revision, a very smart typist, or someone stood over her for further editing while she typed, for in the typed version the commas have disappeared along with the words "puncture wound". They are replaced by "much smaller", which in itself still amounts to an admission of front entrance, for entrance wounds are, generally, "much smaller" than exit wounds.

Further complicating his alterations, on his fourth page, where the handwritten draft said, in consonance with the official thesis, that the posterior, non-fatal wound was "a 7 x 4 mm oval puncture wound", Dr. Humes here struck

pulled up to the aircraft. The engine warm-up had consumed seventy-five to one hundred gallons of fuel and the tanks were being filled again just before take-off. The trip to Berlin and back was expected virtually to dry the tanks. Demolition charges had been attached to the Joan-Eleanor equipment in case the plane fell into enemy hands.

The A-26 began to move, slowly at first, then faster, then streaked down the runway. As the wheels cleared the ground, Commander Simpson checked his watch. It was one minute past midnight.

Could and Simpson were awakened four hours later. They had dozed off in the warmth of the Watton operations hut and began to shiver on re-entering the raw night. Their vigil was short. The aircraft soon appeared, dipping one wing tip. Simpson knew what Captain Walker's signal meant. Minutes later, the A-26 rolled to a halt before the hangar. The huge frame of Derr, the dispatcher, reared from the plane, the blister at the top of the plane. He shot his arms into the air, thumbs up. The mission of Berlin was inside the cockpit, Captain Walker noted that his fuel gauge showed one hundred gallons.

The HAMMER team walked the streets of Berlin in a silence born of awe and disbelief. The capital of Nazi despotism, which they had fled ten years before, now covered under the lash of Allied bombers. Berlin had become a curious mosaic of statchness and ruin, part-functioning, part-shattered, like a handsome woman with gaping wounds.

The pair had dropped thirty miles to the west, near Alt-Friesack. They had walked all the way and on their arrival in Berlin, on the evening of March 2, headed for the home of Paul Land's parents. They were greeted first by shock, then tears of joy. Later, when his parents had time to regain their composure, Paul Land noted proudly that the fire of defiance still burned in them. Both were fifty-seven years old and still militant foes of the regime. The father said to

The Pentagon's release of these films would provide work for unemployed film critics and help balance the budget.

Possible supporting actors in Reagan's classified films are: Al Haig, Henry Kissinger, George Bush (former CIA Director, Reagan's V-P), William Casey, Caspar Weinberger, George Shultz, John McCone, Paul Volcker, Grace Shipping, The Boys from (Bechtel, McCone, and Parsons), a law firm (Donovan, Leisure, Newton, and Lombard), Gerald Ford (a duffer), ITT (operates in over 80 countries), Allen Dulles, Flick Group of West Germany, CIA stunt men, and Richard Nixon ('xx' stands for double-cross) rhymes with Exxon.

Most of these tired actors are Nixon retreads. 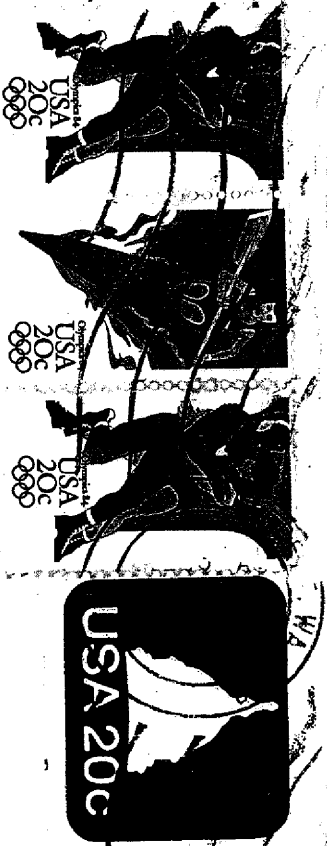
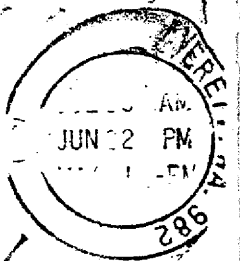
