Dear Chris,

You will have noticed during the seven hours we spent talking about the assassination that I do not like to make claims unless I can document them immediately. When we discussed the acoustics evidence and the search for a tape that might include the shots, I told you that I had raised this question with Blakey. I found the relevant letter but in my haste I did not locate the passage in question. At my leisure later, I did locate the passage. At first I was going to copy only that excerpt from my submission to Blakey, but in the end I retyped the whole business (of which I had only one copy) and it is enclosed herewith.

The passage about the need to search for a record or tape of the shots is at the bottom of page 2. I wish that Blakey and the House Committee had been as diligent in following up the various other questions I raised, but they ignored most of them. Those they did deal with (other than the acoustics) were resolved in a manner which left me unsatisfied.

Chris, I really enjoyed being with you and Bill and reopening the case in my own mind. I had not realized how much I missed working on and talking about the assassination. I felt as if I was "coming alive" after a long hibernation.

I have great hopes for your documentary and will do anything I can to give you any data or advice you may need. Please stay in touch.
