I obtained your address from Bud Fensterwald of the Assassination Archives in Washington, when I was down there last week doing some research.


I am writing you to see if you can provide me with a copy of an article you wrote, as well as telling me how to purchase a copy of "Master Index to the JFK Assassination Investigations". The article I am interested in is "The Curious Testimony of Mr. Givens", which was published in 1971 in the Texas Observer.

I am a Computer Consultant, with experience in computer simulation and reconstruction. I was actually in Sweden on a computer assignment during the assassination time period. Therefore, my bias comes from the Europeans, which "knew" it was a conspiracy from the time Oswald was shot. My interest and approach has always been the scientific one (trajectories, timing, photographs, and less the testimony of people, who even if they are not trying to make self serving or mis-leading statements, may simply be mistaken on what they saw, what they remember, or the exact time it occurred.

I have not, until lately, been the type of serious researcher that you and others are, but I now feel that perhaps fresh eyes may offer some help. There has been a lot of new material which has come out in the past seven years, and some of it places a new angle on some of the various early pieces of evidence provided by the Warren Commission and early researchers, the significance of which may have been overlooked at the time. Thus, I am attempting to go back in time and restudy this material. I am also considering constructing a large, accurate reconstruction of Dealey Plaza.

I have two computers which I am using to collect, collate and project data, and will be glad to supply you with copies of some of my early conclusions, if that is of interest. In addition to the two items mentioned, I would appreciate copies of any material you feel that you can send me that might be pertinent to what I am doing, and will gladly reimburse you for copies or other expenses.
