Dear Mrs Meagher,

I was very pleased to get your letter of May 14 with the information about the jackdaw kit. I have just heard of it from Mrs Dorothy ^{RS} Harris who used to be with ^{the} Spencers Book Co of Los Angeles. She wrote the 1st Bibliography of material on JFK's assassination.

Penn Jones said over the phone (he never writes) that he had one, that was sold by some grocery chain near Dallas. He just mentioned it was a model kit.

I have wrote the Dallas distributors but they never answered. I think my entry no 9 is about the same item. I wrote Cape early in 68 for it as a "book". They never answered. Mr David Sifton has never answered. I have the price at \$17.50 from the Sigtest Corp - The publishers of the addendum. I had to put \$17.50 in my supplement without verification. It seems a high price and being as my advertising is beamed on colleges + Universities, they might not want to pay 17.50 for an addendum (over)

The majority of them will not know the value of it from the description I can give it in an entry. I am making a comment as per item no 11, to give it a better description as I consider it a valuable reference work.

I am spending \$96.00 on stamps alone to mail out the enclosed flyers to 1200 all different Colleges and Universities. I am of the opinion that a direct mailing effort gives the best results.

I have compiled the following for your Index.

"Subject Index to the 26 Volumes of Hearings and 997 Exhibits - Meagher, Sylvia - Ann Arbor - University Microfilms - 1971 - 150p - no illus - \$8.50 cloth, \$6.25 paper - 66-13736 - This is an Index to Entry no 44. Owing to insistent demand from owners of the 26 volumes, this is a reprint of no 99 in book form.
