Dear Mrs. Meagher,

It's been about two months since I last wrote to you, and I just hope things are all right with you. Believe it or not, almost nothing has changed since then so far as my situation is concerned. I'm waiting to hear from numerous governmental agencies to which I have applied, but so far I have been able to find no work outside of temporary office assignments. Yesterday I spent eight hours stapling tags to boxes in a warehouse — it made me think of Oswald's job at the book depository, only he probably made more than \$2 per hour.

Speaking of that subject, I heard on the Channel 5 news a few nights ago about a man named Brown in Connecticut who claims to have discovered that photographs of certain men arrested in Dealey Plaza on Nov. 22 show one person who closely resembled a suspect in the King assassination. WNEW-TV seemed to imply that this was something new, but I clearly recall Gary Schoener mentioning the same evidence in his slide show lecture given in Ithaca two years ago. And didn't Garrison allude to this matter too? Or are these photographs concerned with something different? If it's what I think it is, it's another sad example of the lack of co-ordination and mutual trust among those who (for whatever reason) are still actively researching this subject.

Kathleen Connors will be down in New York again soon. I think she will probably contact you, if she hasn't done so already. She was quite anxious to see you when she was here in April, but had no time to spare.

I hope that by the next time I write I'll have better news. (There's still hope until July 1st as the government usually starts its employees then.) Please keep in touch.
