Speaking of which, the Pentagon Papers have raslly beggled the mind and are the main subject of every conversation here. The documents on the Diem assassination and the JFK policy on Vietnam in the months before 11/22/63 are illuminating, in that they tend to confirm what previously we had to deduce—which is true of the whole mass of the documents.
