all the way thru the details - I knew there
would be reaction re Thompson, Marcus
and also Sprague all vs Z. 227 - obviously
I mean no disrespect - simply another opin-
ion and to synopsisize for you - fig 10
p 48 of Traverse shows chest stationary
Z. 227 - 233. then it begins to turn
right into the crump - also 229 the
SIGNED right hand appears - rising to in front

DATE of face. my thesis is there
must be "lead-time". the hit and
the reaction are not simultaneous
- a response of one-third of a
second (227 - 233) would be normal
- and 227 - 229 only a ninth of a
second would be ok to evoke the
flight or fright reaction - by 234
the turning is happening - it
requires something ahead of
234 to make it happen. I'm
afraid I'm persuaded differently
from you, JT, RM + RES - it's less
than half a second - sincerely
