A friend in the Dallas Symphony orchestra told me that you were now living in New York and I am taking the liberty of writing to ask you to clarify a statement in your book <u>Dallas Public and Private</u>. I am doing research on the right-wing and ultra-conservative groups and your book provided a valuable insight into the causes and effects of extremism in Dallas. On page 198 you refer to the "Wanted for Treason" circular, stating that it appeared in all parts of the city on United Nations Day (which was October 2h, 1963), on the occasion of the Adlai Stevenson incident. Ironically, as I write, the country is experiencing the shock and sadness of Stevenson's sudden death in London.

Can you please confirm that the handbill was in fact circulated on UN Day rather than later in the year? Can you also verify that the handbill referred to President Kennedy and not to Adlai Stevenson?
