I, too, have been working on it singlemindedly since November 22, 1963-when I commented bitterly, and with more truth than I realized, that a leftist was certain to be arrested for the assassination---and within an hour, one was! I have written a 500-page comparative analysis of the Warren Report as opposed to the Hearings and Exhibits (I interrupted that work in order to compile the Subject Index). Fortunately, I have no distractions or duties other than to care for a cat and work at a full-time job which does not impose heavy demands on me except at set times of the year. So it has been possible to do concentrated study and writing.

I an intrigued by your statement that the entire way it happened is clear to you and should you feel free to write somewhat more in specific terms, I should of course feel great interest in your findings.
