1. You may be entirely correct about the spectography. I was not aware that a spectrographic analysis could yield such refined information. In the light of your explanation, I would share your assumption that spectography ruled out rather than kept open the possibility that the metal fragments came from a bullet fired from the Carcano rifle.
