Dear Mrs. Meagher:

During the summer months when pressures of university studies were at a low ebb I undertook further research into the J.F. Kennedy Assassination, a project which I began in January 1964. I wrote to the New York Review of Books in August 1966 requesting bibliographical assistance as regards significant articles and books on this dreadful event. A Mr. M. Harris of the Subscription Department suggested that I contact you in this regard, and furnished me with your address.

What I should like to obtain is a bibliography or suggestions which you may have compiled of articles in a number of magazines and journals which have not received wide broadcast; the same applies to books. As a general guide for you, I have the twenty-six volume Warren Report; virtually all the main (those that are accessible at any rate) books that have been written on the Assassination and Warren Report; all the articles on the Assassination printed in The Minority of One; your subject index to The Warren Report; and a large number of clippings I have managed to cull from newspapers and magazines. (American and Canadian).

After I complete my studies, I hope to undertake a study on the Kennedy Assassination, particularly as regards its political ramifications, before and after the event. For the nonce, however, I must bide my time and develop an extensive bibliography.

I consider the accounts of the Assassination which the U.S. administration and commission have issued to display a contemptuous disregard for clear and consistent thinking and available evidence. The appearance of non sequiturs alone, in the Warren Report are prodigious, an indication of a slovenly examination.
