Dear Moshe,

My thoughts were very much with you during all of last week, while I listened to the UN Security Council and followed the news of the war, first anxiously and then with relief and pride. There has never before in history been such a triumph of the few against the many. Yet how tragic it is that people had to lose their lives and suffer injury, in a war that should not have been necessary if we are, as we like to think, "civilized." I hope that you and your wife and dear ones were spared suffering. Please find time to write me and let me know of your well-being and how you spent those historic days of battle and victory. If it is too difficult to write in English, you might write to my father in Hebrew and he will read me the letter when we speak on the telephone. We tried to send you some money; at first the bank would not accept it, but now I understand it has been transmitted. I hope that it arrives safely—it is the least we can do.
