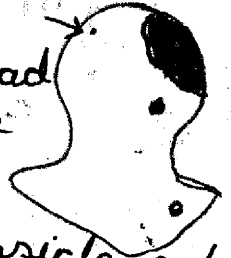


Dear Mrs. Meagher,

Many thanks for your kind letter & the David Ferrie references.

While looking through the 26 volumes it struck me that there seems to be yet another mystery in the autopsy reports namely the fact that exhibit 386 appears to show a small wound in the left of the head in the position shown in the rough sketch. I first spotted



this some time ago but considered it probably some form of error by artist or printer until I read the "Ramparts" article where the case for a possible wound on the left is described. I also recently saw, for the first time Fred G. Cook's articles in "The Nation" where he speaks of a possible bullet in the grass. Gjestem's "Assassin or Fall Guy" speaks of UPI photo DAP 112226 which he says shows a policeman pointing to a bull spot where a bullet was embedded in the ground. Although this photo is not reproduced in the British edition of the book it was apparently in the US edition. Do you know this photo? If so is it the Fague bullet or another? (I called in London

UPI office to look for this photo but they did not have it & said that a copy would probably be in their New York office)

It also seems that there is yet another piece of photographic evidence unseen. Inspector Sawyer (11:324) mentions a photographer in the Dial-Jax building. Is the name of this man known? Depending on the position he was standing he may have been able to see the Oswald window.

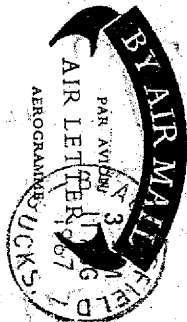
