Regarding your interesting idea for a confrontation with Garrison, it has just struck me that I committed an unconscionable oversight when you called me yesterday. My first recommendation should have been that you invite Leo Sauvage, author of <u>The Oswald</u> <u>Affair</u> and one of the foremost critics of the Warren Report.

I am particularly annoyed with myself for this oversight because Mr. Sauvage was the first among us to see Garrison for what he was, and it was somewhat later that the others I mentioned and I myself came to realize that Garrison was, as Sauvage has termed him, only "the Henry Wade of New Orleans." No one is therefore more entitled than Leo Sauvage to lead the confrontation, if it can be arranged.
