Dear Miss Meagher,

When I visited you approximately two weeks ago, I did so with a genuine respect for your accomplishments and reputation concerning your knowledge of the Warren Reports continually inaccuracies. Also, and primarily, I visited you in hopes of making available to you information in my possession which constitutes, without a doubt, hitherto undisclosed proof that Oswald could not possibly have fired a shot on Nov. 22, 1963. I had intended, after talking to you first, to let you see this proof after first finding out more about your beliefs or disbeliefs concerning Garrison's investigation, which I know is a truthful one in every sense. But after listening patiently to you berate the fine work he and others, such as Mark Lane and Weisberg are doing, I decided to not inform you further, and therefor left you with the impression that all I had of value were some tape recordings. I will, therefor, consult the proper people at the proper time in regards the above mentioned proof. turn

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I am sorry that I cannot confide further with you on this, as I had originally hoped to, but, as you can see, your position on Garrison and others we discussed now make that confidence to you quite impossible. Since I cannot afford, being a poor man, to go to New Orleans myself, at the present time, I will attempt to save money for the train fare, and when I finally have done this, I will present Mr. Garrison's office with this proof personally, as I don't know anyone I can trust to deliver same. May I say that it could have been quite a "feather in your hat," but as for myself, I don't seek any glory; but I don't rest very easily, knowing that my President's murderers, are still walking around as free as a bird. I cannot & will not accept this. I thank you for the courtesy you have shown me when I visited you, but I feel it is best I do this personally, my own way. This way I can be reasonably assured that the truth we are all seeking in this case will come to light.
