As to his new book: I know from personal experience and at first hand how greatly he has distorted at least one incident, at which I was present; and I might add that he plagiarized two pieces of my work in this book. One was a published article on Jenner's incredibly misleading and dishonest broadcast, and the other was an unpublished autopsy on a similarly ignorant and partisan broadcast by Louis Nizer which I had sent Lane, wishing to be helpful, when I learned that he was to confront Nizer in debate (and which he had gratefully promised me he would "put to good use"!).

If there is any deliberate blackout on Lane's book, I suspect it results from the great dislike and disrespect in which he is held by a wide variety of persons, of all shades of opinion and affiliation. Personally I have never encountered the smallest obstruction or harassment; nor do I know of any attempts to suppress other critics whom I know well (Leo Sauvage and J.D. Thompson come to mind). To my sorrow and indignation, the critics' community includes individuals whose personal and professional integrity, or judgment, is an albatross around the neck of the whole effort to liquidate the Warren Report and replace it with as much of the truth as can still be uncovered.
