Dear Mr. Tarshish,

Let me try to answer the questions in your letter of the 10th.

The Sept. 1966 and Oct. 1966 articles were excerpts from the ms. of Accessories; none of the other articles in The Minority of One or any other periodicals are included in my book.

My article in Studies on the Left was a review of 4 books on the Warren Report published in mid-1966 by Epstein, Lane, Savage, and Weisberg. The address is 260 W. Broadway, NYC 10013.

The article in Lattitudes is a series of excerpts from the Warren Report, juxtaposed with corresponding excerpts from the Hearings and Exhibits — which do not correspond, as they should.

The respective titles were "Four Books on the WR: The Summer of Discontent" and "Truth Was Their Only Client." Studies is one dollar a copy.

You ask if your theory could stand examination. The answer is, no. I do not have the time to elaborate why not, it would take 500 pages. No theory can be taken seriously which does not conclusively dispose of the entire body of legitimate evidentiary points embodied in the critics' works. If motive alone was in question, those works would not have been necessary.
