Dear Professor Liebeler,


Please refer to Commission Exhibit No. 1117, Volume XXII of the Hearings and Exhibits, page 82, consisting of a memorandum addressed to you on 17 June 1964 by Richard M. Mosk, on the subject of Oswald's reading and setting forth a list of the books checked out of the New Orleans public library by him.

You will note from the list that Oswald seemingly returned four books to the library on 3 October 1963. But it was evidently established by the Warren Commission and by your investigation in particular that Oswald had departed New Orleans for Mexico City no later than 25 September 1963, or at least a week before he allegedly returned the borrowed books.

Despite the passage of years since your service with the Warren Commission, I wonder if your recollection or your records indicate whether or not this curious anachronism was noticed and, if so, whether any inquiry was conducted to ascertain an explanation of this seemingly unimportant but perplexing discrepancy.

If no inquiry was undertaken then, I should be interested in any suggestions you might have at this time on this matter.
