My best hope seems to be with the government, but it will be literally months before they can possibly hire me, due to red tape, spending cutbacks, etc. The near-impossibility of finding a decent job has led me to consider moving to Australia, but I think I want to stay here at least until 1972, so I can have the satisfaction of voting against Nixon. I suppose it's not all his fault, but he has certainly done his share.

Would you believe — still no word from Gary Schwene! It's about four months since his last letter. For some silly reason, I still have those Thornby materials, but, if I don't hear from Gary soon, I may discard them.
