

# Brzezinski Encouraged by

Peking

Zbigniew Brzezinski, President Carter's national security adviser, said yesterday after talks with Chinese leaders that China and the United States are destined to come closer together for their mutual benefit.

He said in a banquet speech that agreements on international issues outweigh differences between the two countries.

"One theme emerged particularly clearly," he said. "Our shared views outweigh our differences. We both oppose efforts by others to seek a monolithic world."

Brzezinski said he will tell President Carter: "My conclusion is that our two countries are destined to grow closer together for our mutual benefit and for the benefit of all mankind."

The White House security official arrived here Sunday and has held talks with Communist party leader and Premier Hua Kuo-feng, Senior Vice Premier Teng Hsiao-ping and Foreign Minister Huang Hua.

The Chinese have described the discussion on international and bilateral affairs as beneficial to both sides.

Informed diplomatic sources said they feel the talks have taken place in a more positive atmosphere than the relatively frosty mood when Secretary of State Cyrus Vance was in Peking ten months ago.
