Dear Mr. Simon,

I appreciate your comments on my manuscript. Although I am disinclined to counter-comment, I must correct the record with respect to page 170: the phrase "outright perversion of the truth" did not refer to the testimony of FBI expert Robert Frazier, not at all—he was in fact one of the more scrupulous expert witnesses. The phrase referred to assertions which appeared in the Warren Report (page 95) which, in the preceding pages of my manuscript, I had demonstrated as inconsistent with and cynically misrepresentative of the corresponding testimony.

If I may turn to a prosaic matter, you may recall that I submitted my manuscript in two spring-binders, one unlabelled and the other labelled "Volume II." Only one binder, the one marked "Volume II," was returned by your office. Those binders are not inexpensive and I should therefore be glad to have the unmarked one returned at your earliest convenience.
