Dear Mr. Sloane,

Just over a year has gone by since we corresponded about my subject index to the Warren Report and Hearings & Exhibits and related matters. I am happy to report that the Index was published by Scarecrow Press in March and has been useful to researchers, or so they say.

Have you had any second thoughts about the Warren Report and the so-called lone assassin? I am sure that you must have read, or read about, the many books published this summer that challenge the conclusions and in some cases the integrity of the Warren Commission.

My own book-length manuscript (a 600-page comparative study of the Warren Report in conflict with the accompanying Hearings and Exhibits) has been finished for a while. Excerpts appeared in The Minority of One September and October 1966 issues. I haven't had much time to think about getting it published. Fundamentally it is a scholarly rather than a popular work ("scholarly" when some of the polemics are deleted by some strict editor). Do you suppose that Rutgers University Press might have any interest in such a manuscript? Probably not. Just the same, I'd love to hear from you again about your present views on the Warren Report!
