Dear Ken,

The check is absolutely unnecessary and I am returning it herewith. I will be glad to send you any information about broadcasts or articles. I've always tried to do that when I could, but the circle of critics is much larger now, and I have less time than before, so all I had in mind was to save the time of addressing the envelopes—not the costs.

Someone has promised me a discarded machine for making copies of letters, etc., and when that becomes available, it will save typing copies and should simplify the circulation of news items.

I would be very grateful for the transcript of the WNEW-TV three-hour "minority report" on the Warren Report. Typing a three-hour program from the tape would take me at least one week if I did nothing but that. The transcript will save a lot of time and agony.

I had lunch the other day with the chap at Bobbs-Merrill who read my manuscript and he suggested that if it was turned down, he would like to take it to another publisher on my behalf, as he feels strongly that it should be published. So I have only the copy I work with at home and, as I told you, you are welcome to read it here, if that is convenient—although I know it is not always quiet or peaceful. I am strangely lacking in anxiety about publication and feel, probably too complacently, that its time will come and that I should not try to force it into print prematurely.
